Chanukah falls on Dec. 20th this year. Chanukah commemorates the defeat of Syrian, based Greek Hellenists led by Antiochus IV by the Jews under the leadership of Judah the Macabee in the year 165 Following this victory, the B.C.E. Second Temple in Jerusalem was



cleansed of all Hellenistic influences and rededicated (Chanukah) to the worship of the God of Israel. According to a legend, the eternal light burned for eight days on a one day supply of oil.

In Israel, everyone young and old, knows when it is Chanukah. If you walk through any of the towns and cities of Israel you will see a chanukiyah lit on every window sill. The water towers on the kibbutzim are adorned with chanukiyot, as are all the public buildings and synagogues.

During Chanukah schools are closed. As the weather is pleasant at that time of year, hiking is a favorite activity. It is a custom to visit the graves of the Maccabees in Modin. At Modin, a huge bonfire is lit, a torch of freedom is ignited from the bonfire and carried by marathon runners to the large cities. As these runners pass through settlements on their way to the cities, others light their own flames from the torch and use it to light a *chanukiyah* at home.

# METHYL MERCURY FOUND IN SEAFOOD

Everyone knows that fish is good for you, right? What you may not have heard is the same fish that is low in fat, protein, rich and nutritious may contain harmful mercury that causes harm to the brain, spinal cord, kidneys and liver. So if you ear a lot of fish, or eat fish from waters with high mercury levels, it can make you sick. Mercury is especially dangerous to pregnant women or nursing women and children under the age of six. Mercury can damage developing brain cells, causing learning disabilities, impaired motor coordination and birth defects. FDA guidelines advise women in this group to eat no more than one pound of fish or shellfish bought in stores or restaurants per week. Do not eat shark, swordfish, golden or white snapper, or king mackerel because they often have high levels of mercury. This does not mean that all fish are unsafe or that you should not eat any fish. Everyone can minimize their risk of exposure by following the guidelines above, limiting fish intake and eating a variety of different kinds

# IN THE DRIVEWAY By Calvin Yuyen

### Prius, More Than Green

Three years ago, I drove the first generation Prius, Toyota's first hybrid-powered vehicle. Americans have long forgotten about electric vehicles and its inconvenience of daily charging. But they have embraced the combination of both an electric motor and a combustion engine offering great gas mileage. To show they have not rested on their "green" laurels, Toyota engineers now return with the all-new 2004 Prius and Hybrid Synergy Drive.

To see the improvements, I visited Toyota 101. First, the aerodynamically efficient body is sleeker, with a low coefficient of drag (Cd) of only 0.26. The 4-door liftback's smooth shape flows from its slanted hood and compact front grill, to its long

rear roofline. The 2,890 lbs. 5-seater is now considered a midsize car, with interior volume just smaller than the Camry. There is plenty of cargo space; 16.1 cu. feet

Inside, like its predecessor, is the absence of instrumentation immediately behind the steering wheel. Instead, the digital displays for data such as speed, fuel, odometer, and transmission posi-

tion, are offset from the driver in the dash just aft of the windshield. Designed for safety, it's an easy glance from the road. In addition, a LCD touch panel is located in the center dash for the audio and climate controls, and Energy Monitoring. This display also supports the available voice-activated DVD navigation and hands-free phone. Many of these common functions are also conveniently accessible on the Prius steering wheel. The dashmounted touch-control shift lever is By-wire Technology, sending an electrical signal to the transmission instead of a mechanical connection. This is ergonomically designed better than the BMW 7-series.

Its long list of standard features includes ABS brakes, air conditioning, power windows and AM/FM CD stereo system. A "must-have" option is the Smart Entry & Start system. Within proximity, the key fob in your pocket automatically receives and transmits signals to unlock the doors. By pushing the power button on the dash, the Prius will start and run, no ignition key required.

Under the hood is the Hybrid Synergy Drive; a 1.5L DOHC 16-valve/76hp/82 lb.-ft gasoline engine coupled with a

50kW/67hp/295 lb.-ft electric motor. Posted gas mileage is City/Highway/Combined: 60/51/55, a 10% improvement. Operation is seamless and virtually imperceptible to driver and passengers. Its five main modes are:

1. When pulling away from a stop or under a light load, only the electric motor powers the vehicle.

2. In normal driving, power from the gasoline engine is divided by a power-split device between the wheels and the electric generator. The generator runs the electric motor to provide additional power to the wheels.

3. Under full-throttle acceleration, the electric motor is supplemented by power from the batteries.

4. During deceleration or braking, the motor functions as a generator to recharge the batteries. The batteries never need to be recharged from an external source. The gasoline engine also

> shuts down, creating zero exhaust emissions and using no fuel.

5. The battery is regulated to maintain a constant charge. When the charge is low, the electric generator routes power to charge the battery.

The new Prius is not a drag racer, but it has plenty of pep for maneuvering around town and accelerating smoothly to freeway speed.

Power is transferred through a continuously variable transmission to P185/65R15 tires on alloy wheels. Its rack-and-pinion steering with electric power-assist is precise, and overall handling is good. Only on the high-speed curves of Skyline do you feel you should let off slightly. Braking feels strong with the integrated regenerative braking system on the vehicle.

The 2004 Prius is experiencing a very successful launch, with orders out the door. It's larger and better, with more power, but the price remains at \$19, 995 MSRP. An eight-year/100,000 - mile battery and hybrid system warranty is included. The Prius has the comfort and convenience of a real daily driver. This is only the beginning, as Lexus will release an RX330 next year with hybrid power, and it promises to be as fast as a BMW X5.

# NEW MODELS ADORN MUSEUM'S SHIP'S DISPLAY

Museum's Ships Display, for those familiar with the model ships collection on display at the San Mateo County History Museum, will be delighted to learn that the exhibit has been enlarged by four ships. Model maker Charles Parsons, of San Carlos, has contributed the new models to add to the nineteen previously donated and on display in the Museum's Charles Parsons Gallery. Each ship is an original. Fashioned out of blocks of wood and other basic materials, the models are unique works of art. Parsons finds plans for the ships in a variety of ways, including tracking down the original plans of the ships themselves in order to create their models.

### THE FOUR NEW SHIPS ARE:

#### **BLUENOSE CANADIAN FISHING SCHOONER, 1921**

The Bluenose was known as the "Queen of the North Atlantic." Built in Nova Scotia as a banks fisherman, her speed soon became apparent as she worked the rough waters off Newfoundland. In 1921, she won the International Fishermen's Trophy and kept it during an 18 year racing career. Commemorated on a Canadian stamp in 1928, her likeness appears on the Canadian ten-cent coin. Sold for coastal trading in Caribbean waters, the Bluenose struck a reef in waters just off Haiti in January 1946. In 1955, the Bluenose and her captain, J. Angus Walters, were inducted into the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame for their achievements in the International Fishermen's Trophy races.

1:72 scale, completed 2001

#### TRIREME GREEK WARSHIP, CIRCA 500 BC

The trireme-style warship ruled the Mediterranean Sea for nearly two centuries. The Greeks designed the warships so that they were able to ram enemy ships in battle. Trireme warships had three banks of oars on each side. They were quicker and more maneuverable than other ships. There has been some debate as to how the ship was rowed. Some suggest that three men pulled one oar, but the Athenian historian Thucydides stated that each rower pulled one oar. One hundred feet long with a 17 foot beam, a trireme warship was able to travel about 7.5 knots.

1:48 scale, completed 2003

#### FAR WEST American Steam-Powered Riverboat, 1870

The Far West operated on the Missouri and Yellowstone rivers. The ruggedly built sternwheeler usually carried passengers and cargo on the Upper Missouri Rivers between Sioux City and Fort Benton. In 1876, she transported Colonel George Armstrong Custer up to the Little Big Hom where the United States Calvary was waiting for him. The Far West ferried survivors of the Little Big Horn expedition down the Yellowstone River. She sank on a snag in 1883.

1:96 scale, completed 2002

#### H.M.S. REVENGE Elizabeth Galleon, 1574

In 1588, the H.M.S. Revenge carried the flag of Sir Francis Drake during the English encounter with the Spanish Armada. She was one of a small fleet that pestered the enemy until a North Sea gale destroyed the Spanish fleet. In 1591, she was part of a group of English ships waiting to ambush a Spanish fleet transporting treasure from the New World. Separated from the other English vessels, the H.M.S Revenge fought for a day against overwhelming odds before surrendering. The ship sank in a gale with the Spanish prize crew on board.

1:96 scale, completed 2001

All twenty-three ships are currently on display. The San Mateo County History Museum is located at 777 Hamilton Street in Redwood City. Hours are 10 am to 4pm every day except Mondays. Admission is \$4 for adults, \$2 for seniors and children and kids five and under are free.
