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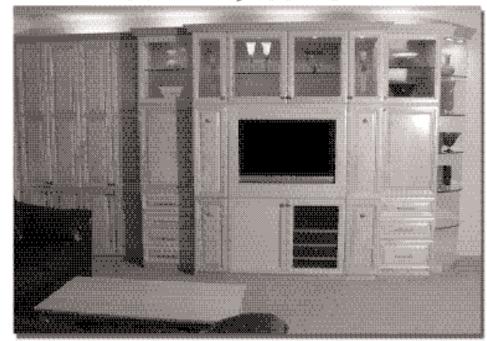

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

HELP YOUR FAMILY WHEN DISASTER STRIKES

In October 2005, a 7.6-magnitude earthquake hit the northern areas of Pakistan. That December, I participated in a Pakistan earthquake relief trip. Being present at the site of such utter destruction; walking over rubble of what once were homes, schools and hotels; and hearing people's stories of lost loved ones are experiences that I will never forget.

We never know when disaster will strike. In some cases, people may have to evacuate their neighborhoods or remain confined in their homes without basic services such as water, gas, electricity or phones. While relief workers get to a disaster scene as quickly as possible, it's important to do as much as you can do to be prepared to help your family until relief arrives.

Following are highlights from the "Four Steps to Safety" from the "Family Disaster Plan," developed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the American Red Cross. For the complete list, visit www.redcross.org.

1. FIND OUT WHAT COULD HAPPEN TO YOU.

- * Know what types of disasters are most likely in your area.
- * Find out how to help elderly or disabled persons.
- * Find out about the disaster plans at your workplace, your children's school or day care center, and other places where your family spends time.
- * Ask about animal care after a disaster. Animals are not allowed inside emergency shelters because of health regulations

2. CREATE A DISASTER PLAN.

- * Meet with your family and discuss why you need to prepare for disaster. Plan to share responsibilities and work together as a team.
- * Discuss the types of disasters that are most likely to happen. Explain what to do in each case.
- * Pick two places to meet:
 - 1. Right outside your home in case of a sudden emergency, like a fire.
 - 2. Outside your neighborhood in case you can't return home. Everyone must know the address and phone number.
- * Ask an out-of-state friend to be your "family contact." After a disaster, it's often easier to call long distance.
- * Discuss what to do in an evacuation.

3. COMPLETE THIS CHECKLIST.

- * Post emergency telephone numbers by phones (fire, police, ambulance, etc.).
- * Teach children how and when to call 9-1-1 or your local

Emergency Medical Services number.

- * Show each family member how and when to turn off the utilities at the main switches.
- * Install smoke detectors on each level of your home, especially near bedrooms.
- * Conduct a home hazard hunt.
- * Stock emergency supplies and assemble a disaster supplies kit.
- * Take a first aid and CPR class.
- * Determine the best escape routes from your home.

4. PRACTICE AND MAINTAIN YOUR PLAN.

- * Quiz your kids every six months or so.
- * Conduct fire and emergency evacuations.
- * Replace stored water and stored food every six months.
- * Test and recharge your fire extinguisher(s).
- * Test your smoke detectors monthly and change the batteries at least once a year.

We can't predict when a disaster will strike, but we can be prepared. When the unexpected happens, a little planning can keep your family safe until help arrives.

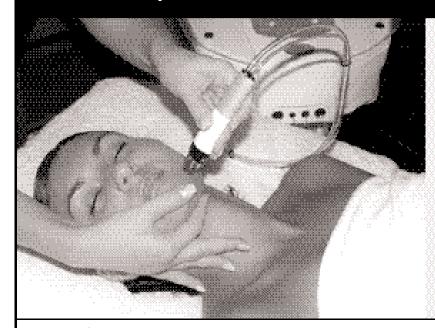

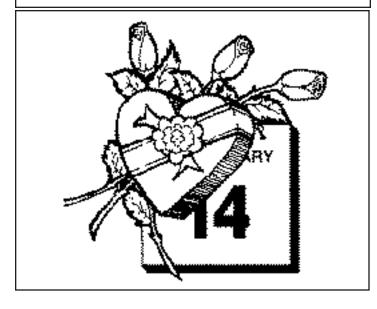

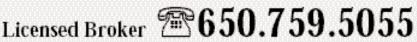

The water in the reservoir behind the Nob Hill Market is very low, so there are not many birds there or the pelicans, which is too bad as it is a great place to watch them all. Lastly, and extremely important - is that the drains you see in some our streets ARE NOT SEWER DRAINS, but conduits from the street for any water that should collect to re-renter directly into the lagoons. I have seen people throw cigarettes into them, empty bottles and hose down their driveways after washing the car. Also, if you intend to have your carpets cleaned please be sure that the company you hire is aware they cannot dump the dirty water down these drains - as it goes immediately into the lagoon water. 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GARDENING TIPS FROM CARLMONT NURSERY

SHRUBS THAT WELCOME SPRING

We are all looking forward to spring with its warmer weather and a brighter landscape to enjoy. Here are some shrubs with flowers that bloom early in the season. Come in and select some you especially like, they'll return year after year to signal the beginning of the spring season.

- Camellias fit beautifully into every garden. The perfectly formed flowers in red, white and pink, are produced on branches with deep green shiny leaves.
- Cistus (rockrose) is available in several varieties. Most plants produce larger flowers
- Daphne odora, called winter daphne, begins to flower in mid winter and continues into early spring. The unique fragrance fills the air during a time most other plants are dormant. The flower buds emerge purple, then mature into small pinkish white flowers.
- Viburnum is made up of a very large family of diverse plants, most with clusters of white, sometimes fragrant, flowers and attractive leaves. Some produce brightly colored fruit, well-liked by birds.
- Weigela, an old favorite, has pink trumpet shaped flowers that attract hummingbirds. The arching branches covered

with blooms, sweep gracefully to the ground. Foliage is medium green. Some newer varieties are available-their flowers are deeper pink and foliage is purple.

FLOWERS MAKE US HAPPY!

Now, in the dead of winter, is an excellent time to dream about glorious spring flowers! As you outline your spring gardening

plan, be sure to include a cutting garden. (The following information is being provided as a reminder that Valentine's Day is near!) A bouquet if fresh flowers can certainly brighten everyone's spirit, and researchers have found that having fresh cut flowers in the home affects a wide variety of emotions. Among their findings, Harvard Medical School researchers found some interesting information. People with fresh flowers in their house, even for a few days, had fewer negative feelings and greater compassion and kindness toward others.
